I. Introduction

A. Topic and Issue:

There is no doubt that the population is aging rapidly. Ageism, which includes infantilization, is a discriminatory practice in which seniors are revoked their adult status. With increasing amounts of seniors in our communities it is becoming more and more important that we find practical solutions to address seniors' social, physical and mental needs.²

- "Given that the population is rapidly aging, there will be a 140% increase of seniors by year 2030" (Sokolovsky 2009:13)
- In our own service learning experience we found that the environment surrounding senior volunteerism steered us to choose simple activities, such as decorating cookies, watching movies, making cards and playing games.³

B. Research Question:

• Why did our service-learning group, in collaboration with the SASH coordinator and resident director chose "childlike" activities for our volunteer events with seniors?

C. Thesis Statement:

• Senior residents favor simple activities because they are inclusive, they initiate conversation and are cost effective.
