Context of Community Organizations: Non-profit Sector in Vermont

- <u>How Vermont's Nonprofit Sector became a \$68 billion industry</u>, series on the non-profit sector in *Seven Days 2019*.
- <u>Common Good Vermont</u>: clearinghouse and source of overview information on the nonprofit sector. Interesting data comparing counties, issues, etc. Helpful for providing context for students in community organizations.

 - Provides a useful overview of key issues in Chittenden County and efforts to address them. Special attention to housing and the opiate epidemic, and then to the pandemic impacts + racial disparities.

Homelessness

• Locked Out: Vermont's Housing Crisis (2023)

- 12-part Special Report (series) from Seven Days on the housing crisis; this site also gathered related articles not part of the special report. The special report articles are clearly identified.
- "In our words, in our community" an online exhibit created by the Vermont Folklife Center in collaboration with CVOEO (Champlain Valley Office of Economic Opportunity)
 - o "amplifies the voices of our neighbors experiencing the complex dynamics of homelessness, food insecurity, and economic challenges. This exhibit is guided by direct input from a group of Vermonters and the social service workers who aim to address their daily needs"

Opioid Epidemic

- Hooked: Stories + Solutions from Vermont's Opioid Crisis (2019)
 - o A series from Seven Days exploring Vermont's response and the then-current crisis.
- Vermont's Relapse: Efforts to Address Opioid Addiction Were Starting to Work. Then Potent New Street Drugs Arrived (June 2023)
 - o Important update to the above exploring important factors in current epidemic.

 - "This non-fiction comics anthology presents stories of survival and healing told by Latin American migrant farmworkers in Vermont, and drawn by New England cartoonists as part of the El Viaje Más Caro Project-a health care outreach effort of the Open Door Clinic in Middlebury and UVM Extension's Bridges to Health Program aimed at addressing the overlooked mental health needs of these vulnerable immigrants. Originally distributed to farm workers as individual Spanish language comic books, this collected edition brings the lives and voices-as well as the challenges and hardships-of these workers to an English-language audience, granting insight into the experiences and lives of the people vital to producing the food we eat."
